Note:

1. The lead implementing agencies are responsible for ensuring the implementation of the Action Plan's provisions.
2. The report is prepared by the lead implementers, taking into account information provided by co-implementers, ministries and agencies, local executive bodies of state power, and other organizations, and after the results are summarized, it is submitted to the Agency for State Financial Control and Anti-Corruption of the Republic of Tajikistan.
3. Ministries and agencies, local executive bodies of state power, and other organizations shall, upon request by the lead implementing agency, prepare the information within the established timeframes and provide it to the requesting party.

4. The budget funds allocated for the implementation of the Plan shall be spent within the limits of the funds established for the maintenance of the relevant agencies.
5. In cases where no funds are allocated, if financing becomes necessary, expenditures shall be covered by administrative funds and development partners.
